## Huntington Park, Maywood, Bell, Boyle Heights and East Los Angeles Fed up Residents Demand the Immediate Shut Down of Exide Technologies

Residents of East and Southeast Los Angeles will come together to honor those that have passed and March to demand the immediate shut down of Exide Technologies, a gross polluter in the community.
